BY THE GLASS

SPARKLING

- 2020 **Pét-Nat Rosé** St. Cyr, Beaujolais 16 · 64
Pure bottled joy, 100% Gamay with flavors of juicy strawberries, yellow peach, and riverbed stones, with a refreshing sparkle. Gone before you know it, and so's the next bottle.
- NV **Wild Blueberry Sparkling Wine** Bluet, Jefferson, ME 14 · 56
Wild blue fruit, bone-dry and effervescent, with flavors of blueberry shrub and olive tapenade (think N. Rhône Syrah). 100% wild blueberries. No, it's not blue, but it's not not-blue.
- NV **Champagne** Pierre Paillard "Les Parcelles" Extra Brut 32 · 76
Bouzy Grand Cru (HALF BOTTLE)
Dry for an Extra Brut but rich and generous, detailed and structured, with flavors of lemon zest, stone fruit, and warm toast. Estate-grown from purely Grand Cru plots of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay.

WHITE

- 2020 **White Blend** Old Westminster Winery 14 · 56
"Blinded By the Light," Westminster, MD
Salty dry pineapple Margarita vibes. Lightly spritzy. A blend of a white piquette (or pomace wine) from field grapes with wine made from Grüner Veltliner & the hybrid grape Vidal Blanc, cut with a little verjus for a refreshing finish.
- 2020 **Jacquère** Domaine des Ardoisières, Vin Des Allobroges 19 · 76
"Silice Blanc," Savoie
Not every wine that comes down to us from the snowy Savoie tastes like the clear water of a mountain stream, but this one does: you can feel the snap in the quiet air.
- 2020 **Dry Aylar Riesling** Peter Lauer 19 · 76
"Fass 6 Senior," Saar, Germany
Electric but lushly fruited Riesling from a master, who makes this bottling (from Grand Cru fruit) in the style his grandfather loved: dry-drinking and racy, but with dimension and joy to the fruit. Prost!
- 2019 **Bourgogne Aligoté** David Trousselle, 15 · 60
Hautes-Côtes de Beaune, France
Rich but bright, aromatic and elegant, food-friendly and balanced white Burgundy with flavors of lemon zest, dry stones, and crème fraîche.

ORANGE & AMBER

- 2018 **Field Blend** (LIGHT SKIN CONTACT) Vinous Obscura 19 · 76
“Gem Satz,” Willamette, OR
14 grape varieties = one seriously complex wine, dry but with flavors of dark honey, iced tea, and tangerine marmalade. Exciting, different, delicious.
- 2020 **Pinot Gris** Mooa “Candy,” Lodi Valley, CA 16 · 64
Bright, gluggable, sunshine-colored and sunshine-flavored cloudy orange. Perfect for picnics, at ground level or six stories up.
- 2015 **Roditis** Tatsis, Macedonia, Greece 19 · 76
Savory (think olive brine and salted almonds), brisk, complex, and more-ish: you’ll go back for another sip just to figure out what you’re tasting.
- 2018 **Kisi** Marani Casreli, Kakheti, Georgia 19 · 76
Very dry, aromatic, and bold, with aromas of apricots, peach pit, and dried leaves. Amphora-aged. Deep amber color.

ROSÉ

- 2020 **Rosé** (DRAFT) Clos Cibonne “Tentations,” Provence, France 15 · -
A refreshing and light-bodied drought of summer from one of our favorite Provençal winemakers.
- 2019 **White Zinfandel** Monte Rio Cellars, Suisun Valley, CA 13 · 52
Dry, with flavors of watermelon, rhubarb, and lime zest, and a crisp snap of a finish—Sutter Home this isn’t.
- 2020 **Rosé-ish** La Salada “Roig Boig,” Penedès, Catalonia 17 · 68
The name translates to “crazy red,” and it’s at least half right: a field blend of grapes of all colors, some lightly macerated, some not at all, it drinks like a fuller-flavored but mineral-driven rosé.

CHILLED RED

- 2019 **Mencía** Guímaro, Ribeira Sacra, Galicia 14 · 56
Mencía doing Cru Beaujolais things: juicy, nervy, joyous, with bright fresh red fruit but a stony mineral core. Savory undertones (tomato leaf, black pepper, smoke).
- 2019 **Cheverny Rouge** Philip Tessier “Point du Jour,” 18 · 72
Loire, France
Beautiful old vine Pinot Noir (with a helping of Gamay), fresh and aromatic with strawberries, dark fruits, and fenugreek. Mild tannins, bright flavor.

RED

- 2019 **Manto Negro** Ca’n Verdura, Binissalem, Mallorca 16 · 64
A full-flavored island wine, drinking a bit like a southern Côtes du Rhône but with a Cab Sauv backbone: a bold red in summertime clothes.

- 0.0% **Sparkling Riesling** Leitz “Eins-Zwei-Zero,” Rheingau 11 · 34
Zippy and off-dry
- 0.0% **Verjus blanc** Wolffer Estate, Sagaponack, LI 11 · 34
Bright and easy

BY THE BOTTLE

SPARKLING

- 2020 **Bubbles** Lares “Chimera,” Willamette Valley, OR 68
D2 *A blend of Pinot Gris, Riesling, & barrel-fermented apple that’s crisp, mild, and easy. The idea for this one came to the winemaker in a dream. It drinks like having a green apple on a beach.*
- 2020 **Pét-Nat** Mersel Wines “Leb Nat Gold,” Bekaa Valley, Lebanon 72
D1 *From one of the oldest wine regions in the world, vinified from the indigenous Merwah and the well-traveled Viogner, this tastes like green apples, seaspray, and white apricots.*
- 2016 **Crémant d’Alsace Rosé** Dirler-Cadé “Brut Nature” 68
E2 *How rare to find Crémant this delicious and distinctive that still scratches the Champagne itch—and a vintage Crémant at that. Bone dry but luscious, with bright summery red berries (from 100% Pinot Noir) framed by warm toast and minerals. Classy and classic.*
- 2014 **Champagne** Bourgeois Diaz “BD’3CC–Brut Nature,” 124
Crouttes-sur-Marne
F2 *A blend of Champagne’s three main grapes, or cépages (hence the name), it’s a characterful and complex mix of Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, and Meunier, with sunny, boisterous flavors of tropical fruits, lime zest, and brioche, and a slight mineral funk. More-ish and adventurous.*
- 2016 **Champagne Blanc de Noirs** Flavien Nowack 166
“La Fontinette–Extra Brut,” Vandieres
D6 *Simply spectacular, 100% Meunier done with a level of detail and complexity that belies the juicy friendliness of the grape. One of the more exciting wines to emerge from Champagne in the last decade.*
- NV **Champagne Rosé de Saignée 1er Cru** Larmandier-Bernier 200
“Extra Brut,” Vertus
F6 *A darker, fuller-flavored sparkling rosé of Pinot Noir & Pinot Gris, bold and lively, tasting a bit like a bottled Negroni Sbagliato.*
- NV **Sparkling Junmai Sake** Fukucho “Seaside,” (500ML) 69
Akitsu, Hiroshima
E5 *Beautiful Champagne-method sake brewed from heritage rice, made by a woman toji (master brewer); this tastes like honeydew, lemon peel, and white flowers, with a mineral quality like snowmelt. Rare and special.*

WHITE & LIGHT SKIN CONTACT

- 2019 **Sauvignon Blanc** La Grange Tiphaine “Trinqu’âmes,” 52
Touraine, Loire
- D5 *The Delecheneaus make world class Loire Sauvignon Blanc. This one tastes of lemongrass, lemon zest, and green fruits, with beautiful clarity of flavor and a mouth-watering finish.*
- 2019 **Moscatel** Leonardo Erazo “La Ruptura,” Valle del Itata, Chile 60
- F1 *Moscatel can make gorgeous wines when it’s vinified dry, and Erazo’s is fresh, energetic, and saline, with the intense, wild aromatics of Moscatel (think orange blossom, jasmine, and bright tropical fruit) tamed by tingly acidity and a lush body. A favorite.*
- 2018 **Xarel’lo** Enric Soler “Espenyalluchs,” Alt Penedès, Catalonia 124
- D3 *Is Enric Soler the best winemaker in Spain? His whites—most exclusively from Xarel’lo, and showcasing the Burgundy-esque dimension and deliciousness the grape possesses in still wine form—make a strong case. Maybe the strongest is this bottling, which drinks a bit like 1er Cru Meursault shot through with sunshine, but with a character that’s all Penedès.*
- 2018 **Chablis 1er Cru “Côte de Savant”** Domaine 47°N 3°E 120
(Guillaume Michaut)
- E4 *Michaut’s wines are new to the US, which is the only reason we’re able to offer this as easily as we do. Simply, this is stunning white Burgundy, with a savory mineral character that’s telltale Chablis, but an oxidative, aromatic richness that speaks of long years ahead of it. Organically farmed, native yeasts, oak-aged, and inspired.*
- 2018 **Bianco** Aldo Viola “Biancoviola,” Sicily 80
- A3 *A blend of Catarrato, Grillo, and Garganega, this has a steely mineral quality underlying yellow citrus and seaspray. Clean and vibrant.*
- 2017 **Furmint Sec** Királyudvar, Tokaji, Hungary 64
- E1 *Energetic dry Furmint that seems to change with every sip: crisp and mineral one minute, rich and honeyed the next, but always delicious, either accompanying food, or as its own main course.*

- 2016 **Carignan Blanc (and friends)** Domaine La Réaltière 128
“Cante Gau,” Coteaux d’Aix en Provence
- A1 *A spectacular, full-bodied southern French white, dense but energetic, with nuanced and evolving flavors, structurally and aromatically complex but fresh and versatile. From a rare (and wrongly maligned) grape, organically farmed. A future classic. We recommend a quick decant.*

ORANGE & MORE SKIN CONTACT

- 2020 **Grüner Veltliner** Bauer “Höllötrio,” 52
Österreich, Austria (LITER)
- B3 *Easy-drinking large format organic orange with intensified Grüner flavors of white pepper, lime zest, and white tea.*
- 2020 **Pinot Gris** St. Reginald Parish “The Marigny,” 72
Willamette Valley, Oregon
- B2 *Carbonic Pinot makes for a bright, cloudy orange wine with flavors of pink grapefruit, pomelo, salty olives, and lime sorbet.*
- 2018 **Zibibbo** Brash Higgins “ZBO,” Ricca Terra Farms, 80
Riverland, South Australia
- E3 *Aka organically farmed Muscat, amphora-aged with prolonged skin contact by the garrulous, gentlemanly American ex-pat Brad Hickey. The wine develops under Flor, Sherry-style, and the result is wild: bright orange peel, jasmine white tip tea, dry stones, and a million other aromas. Sui generis. One of our favorite wines on this list.*
- 2016 **Malvazija** Čotar, Kras, Slovenia 98
- C3 *Intriguingly perfumed, oak-aged skin contact Malvasia with unusual flavors of bitter orange, sour cherry, white tea, and warm spices.*

ROSÉ & ROSÉ-ISH

- 2017 **Vin d'Alsace** Binner “Si Rose...” 88
 C1 *This is skin contact Pinot Gris and Gewürztraminer, which means a lot of people would call this an orange wine, and yet... just look at that beautiful blush color. Whatever you choose to call it, it's delicious, with explosive flavors of rose petals, warm tropical fruits, and ginger, and an elegance that belies its ripe flavors.*
- 2020 **Clairet** Château Massereau, Bordeaux 64
 B1 *Beautiful old school dark rosé (or is it a light red?) from one of the pioneer organic farmers in Bordeaux, mostly Merlot blended with a couple of Cabernets, with flavors of wild strawberries and lemon zest over a graphite-y mineral core. Lovable.*
- 2020 **Pinot Noir & Chardonnay** Scotty-Boy! “El Sandweech!!!” 72
 Santa Barbara, California
 A2 *Equal parts co-fermented carbonic maceration of the Burgundy stalwarts (hence the name), but there's nothing classic (or classy) about this: it's pure picnic juice. It's just a very grungy, druggy picnic.*

RED

- 2020 **Pipeño** Estación Yumbel, Bío Bío, Chile 48
 C6 *Delicious old school, old bush vine País, aged in barrels of indigenous wood, making for a wine of crunchy red fruit, aromatic herbs, and a wonderful intensity that doesn't get in the way of its drinkability.*
- 2020 **Baco Noir & Chardonnay** Neu Cellars “Crispy,”
 Old Mission Peninsula, Michigan 72
 B4 *Yes, there's good (even really good) wine being made in Michigan. No, this is probably not technically a red wine, being half Chard, but it looks and drinks like one, albeit a saltwater-tinged, energetic, summer-y red that suggests an exciting future for one of this country's emerging wine regions. And based on this bottle, that future is now.*
- 2018 **Trousseau** Joseph Dorbon “Vieilles Vignes,” Arbois, Jura 100
 A6 *Remarkably pure and pretty Trousseau highlighting flavors of red fruits, birch, mint, black pepper, and tea. Outstanding.*

- 2016 **Savigny-lès-Beaune** Jean-Pierre Guyon “Les Planchots” 126
 C4 *Gorgeously developing, approachable red Burgundy with classic Pinot flavors of red berries, crushed roses and violets, and wet soil, with hints of mushroom and crushed rock. The Platonic ideal of a village-level red Burgundy to drink al fresco.*
- 2019 **Syrah** Domaine Romaneaux-Destezet (Hervé Souhaut), 98
 Ardèche
 A4 *Souhaut makes some of our favorite new-school Syrah, with a concentration of black fruit, olive, and granite that recalls more exalted Rhône appellations but a lift and a nervy energy that recalls great Cru Beaujolais. (He makes a killer Gamay, too.) This is one of our go-to reds in the building: versatile, food-friendly, and delicious for most any palate, but hard to mistake for any other bottle.*
- 2019 **Cinsault** Mingaco “Cosecha del año,” 80
 Secano Interior de Yumbel, Chile
 C5 *What a beautiful wine: fresh but full-bodied, biodynamically farmed Cinsault from a promising young winemaking duo. Bright and brandied black cherries with sage and eucalyptus (you almost think you’re drinking Australian for a moment), juicy but complex, with a long finish. If you’re looking for something new, try this; if you’re looking for a Grenache, or Shiraz, or even a Cab and you’re willing to try something different, you’ll be rewarded.*
- 2019 **Red blend** Pearl Morissette “Primesautier,” 68
 Niagara Peninsula, Ontario
 A5 *This blend of Lemberger (aka Blaufränkisch), Cab Franc, and Merlot is lush and enveloping, with spicy dark fruit and silky tannins.*
- 2017 **Syrah & Tempranillo** La Ferme Rouge “Terre Rouge,” 60
 Les Côtes de Rommani, Zaër, Morocco
 B5 *Powerful and warm, with elegant tannins, red and black fruit, and a whiff of smoke, or desert air.*

LARGE FORMAT

- 2014 Sekt Andi Knauss 200
"Brut Zero," Württemberg, Germany (MAGNUM)
- X1 *Superb, sparkling Riesling made in the traditional method, with no added sugar or sulfur. Chalky, bright, and mineral.*
- 2018 Tavel Rosé Château de Trinquedel (3 LITERS) 300
- X2 *World class rosé from the only Rhône appellation devoted to rosé, dark in color but light in flavors, sophisticated but fun and delicious.*
- 2016 Rosato Frank Cornelissen "Susucaru," Sicily (3 LITERS) 380
- X3 *A supersized bottling of one of the world's favorite pink wines: why wouldn't you drink this?*
- 2017 Pinot Noir Christian Tschida "Brutal!!!," 240
Neusiedlersee, Austria (MAGNUM)
- X4 *Crunchy, punchy Pinot from one of the best winemakers in Austria, fruit-forward but layered and energetic, made with nothing added, nothing taken away.*
